Pimpalner Education Society was established by Late Karm. Bandu Bapuji Alias Shri. Anandrao Manikrao Patil to cater the educational needs of the tribal students. This institution runs one senior college, one junior college, one D.Ed. college, three high schools, one primary school, three hostels, YCMOU Centre, M.C.V.C and about 4000+ students taking education from this institution.

Rules and information of the admission process

For Ist year admission

$oldsymbol{\square}$ Student passing XII th (HSC) or its equivalent examination is eligible for		
admission to the respected faculty.		
☐ Student seeking admission to this college will have to submit properly		
filled admission form along with required fees on the specified date.		
☐ Original Leaving certificate, HSC Mark sheet, Caste, Income,		
Domicile, Nationality certificate must be submitted for First Year		
admission.		
☐ The document like leaving certificate, migration certificate, eligibility,		
scholarship form, EBC form, certificate of N.C.C/N.S.S., library etc. must		
be submitted for admission.		
☐ 12th mark sheet, leaving certificate Xerox must be kept in spare with		
the students. Once document submitted in the office will not give to the		
students.		
$\hfill \Box$ Concession in fees/scholarship etc. forms must be filled in time for		
which students will be responsible. If the concession is rejected, total fees		
will be charged.		
\square Before taking admission students must read the prospectus carefully.		
Once the subject is filled there will not be change.		
☐ While admission if the student produces faulty document his/ her		
admission will be cancelled.		
☐ According to university act I16 one student will not be admitted to two		
degree courses at a time.		

UNIVERSITY ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE

First Year B.A. /B.Com./B.Sc. students must have to fill their eligibility form. They must give their original mark sheet to the university without which the eligibility will not be confirmed.

Students must be in touch with the office for the documentation. They must submit their documents in time students from other universities must seek information from the office for eligibility.

TRANSFERENCE CERTIFICATE

This certificate (T.C) is given on student's demand while he/ she want to change the college within the same University. For T.C. student should fill the T.C. demand form, with this form he/she should clear that, he had no any dues, no breakage, no incompletion of B.C / EBC form, no book dues etc. Along with that he/she must mention in that form the years of F.Y / S.Y / T.Y. of their degree, Roll no. Xerox copy of last year mark sheet is to be attached with that form. After submission of the T.C. demand form & due his fees, he can get his / her T.C. within 3 days.

MIGRATION CERTIFICATE

For change in university this migration certificate is necessary for student first admission in the university and if he / she wants to change the university he/she has to apply for migration, T.C. marks list, fees / DD. etc. document are necessary for which they have to contact the office.

FEES

- A) B.A / B.Com / B.Sc. fees should be paid to the office cashier.
- B) For the students E.B.C/S,C/S.T/O,B.C/VJNT/SBC etc. have to pay the fees according to the prospectus, if the student leaves the college before sanction scholarship have to pay his full fees.
- C) Payment of complete fees is to be considered as confirmation of admission.

IDENTITY CARD
☐ After admission process within week every student must have college identity
card from library which is necessary. For I-card they must take printed application
form which is in the prospectus form should be filled with self-attested recent
photo. One extra photograph is needed to attach to the form student should be
present personally to get I-card. Student's blood group, his/her signature, librarian's
signature, principal's signature is necessary.
☐ Students must keep their identity card along with them for library use,
examination and in the class etc.
☐ Student must show their identity card to the teaching & non-teaching staff when
needed.
☐ If the I-card is lost the student himself will be held responsible. For new I-Card
fees of Rs. 50 will be charged & new identity card will be issued.
☐ Failure students also must keep their I-Card with them.
☐ Do not change the photo of the I-Card without permission. If he / she does so
he/she him/herself will be responsible.
☐ I-Card Photo & Exam hall ticket photo should be similar. (Recent Photo
essential)
☐ After seeking admission student should procure the identity card duly sign by
the college authority, identity card should be produced by the students whenever
demanded by the college authority in the college campus, signature is necessary.
